From the "Pen" of Pastor Paula

It was Valentine's Day, 2025. Brian Gibbs, the Education Park Ranger for the Effigy Mounds National Monument at Harper's Ferry, Iowa, joined hundreds of other National Park Service employees as well as thousands of other federal employees abruptly, cruelly and in some cases, illegally fired from their positions. Gibbs wrote on Facebook that he "was a dedicated civil servant...that [he had] a work evaluation that exceeds expectations...a United States flag raiser and folder," etc. "I am the voice for 19 American Indian cultures. I am the protector of 2500 year old American Indian burial and ceremonial mounds. I am the defender of your public lands and water...I am the highlight of your child's school day... I am the lesson that showed your children that we live in a world of gifts—not commodities, that gratitude and reciprocity are the doorway to true abundance, not power, money or fear. I am the one who taught your kid the thrush's song and the hawk's cry. I am the wildflower that brought your student joy. I am the one who told your child that they belong on this planet, their unique gifts and existence matters......I am tired of waking up every morning at 2 a.m., wondering how I am going to provide for my family if I lose my job. I am tired of wiping away my wife's tears and reassuring her that things will be ok for us and our growing little family that she is carrying. Things are not ok. I am not ok. This is the second time in 5 years that a dream job I worked has been eliminated. Now I may need to uproot [again]."

Gibbs' story of pain and grief is multiplied across this nation and among American citizens around the globe, people from all types of backgrounds who have been working hard to provide us with safe lives, food, water, transportation, worked to keep us safe from disease and protect us from destructive forces. The stories of these people and their firings are vivid reminders of the consequences of hatred and fear, corruption and cruelty, revenge and retaliation.

As Gibbs so eloquently expresses, "... we live in a world of gifts—not commodities, that gratitude and reciprocity are the doorway to true abundance, not power, money or fear.....I am the one who told your child that they belong on this planet, their unique gifts and existence matters."

Is healing possible for all involved? Or is it too late? The answer lies in us, our words, our actions in the time ahead. A few years ago, a UCC T-shirt offered this message: Rise Up! Spirituality Is Resistance. Spiritual resistance does not use evil, inhumane methods designed that inflict pain on others. Instead, Jesus teaches us that spiritual resistance involves living a healthier way; a way that builds love, bestows grace, encourages harmony and acceptance, a way that breaks the cycle of physical and verbal violence. This way is found in the Sermon on the Mount found in Matthew, chapters 5-7 and the Sermon on the Plain found in Luke, chapters 16:17-49. Please reflect on those passages in the coming season of Lent and use them as a guide for living.
